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SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, that helps me a lot, Senator. Thank you very much.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. Senator Coordsen, I got a little bit...

SENATOR COORDSEN: Yes, sir.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...uncertain here as we started into this. Is this strictly about basically abandoned homesteads?

SENATOR COORDSEN: No, this is about occupied homesteads also. This would provide, because as you well know, even in your area, that a farm site may or may not become a home site in the future. You know around population, Senator, for an example, many, many farm sites are separated off and do become acreages and do become occupied by people who are not involved in agriculture.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Does this bill affect that particular issue at this...

SENATOR COORDSEN: No, it does not change...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: All right, thank you. That's what I...

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...the market valuation of land that's not used for agricultural purposes. If your home site, though, for an example, I mean your farm site, for an example, is being valued as an acreage or some other use, it would have an effect on that. Is that...the real estate under the buildings...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...would be valued as if it were agricultural land, soil type and that sort of thing.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, the reason I ask, when Senator Beutler was asking about the exception, the simple way to solve the exemption...exception is simply to doze the buildings down or
