we need to revisit once again the underlying motivation for this policy in the first place, and then decide whether that motivation, that rationale has changed since the time that we passed it, and whether we do not have as strong a feeling about keeping these individuals in the state of Nebraska upon their retirement or when they take a golden parachute. And once again, I will say that even though the numbers that were quoted sound enormously large, some of those real high income individuals have a lot of options for sheltering their...themselves from taxes anyway. But the individuals who are...who have accumulated a great deal of stock over a period of years may not have the same options, but they do have one pretty strong option, and that is to move those resources out of the state of Nebraska, so that that capital is not here for expansion,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: ...so that those individuals are not here to keep this economy growing. And I would ask those of you who are wavering on this bill and thinking about possibly supporting it to look at what has happened financially in the state of Nebraska since some of these economic development activities were put in place. And if you look at the growth in the state of Nebraska, in some of these companies and individuals who stayed here and started other companies, I think that we have accomplished with our policy what we wanted to accomplish. And now if we're going to change it I think we have to change it with our eyes wide open that we will see a retrenchment in that way, in that area. We will never, never, never see the revenue that has been projected, this \$36 million,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BROWN: ...it will be gone. Thank you.
