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state of Nebraska, that that should be rational tax policy, and that it ought to apply fairly and equitably, equitably is the key, I think, to all people in the state of Nebraska. And I did not believe that that particular bill, the number of which escapes me at this moment, did in fact fill in those personal measures of merit for me at that time. And I find this morning, although I had actually forgotten that I cosponsored this particular bill, I find this morning that my feelings haven't changed much over the years and that this particular provision of the LB 775 package of bills is still an onerous bill. I still believe that it was poor tax policy at the time, that it resulted in very, very beneficial treatment, at least to the extent that the value was measured to the left of the decimal point, for a very small group of people in Nebraska, and was not good, rational tax policy. And I believe that if we have the opportunity this morning to make positive changes in this bill that reflects what we believe today, perhaps we ought to listen to a reasoned debate, and there are opposing points of view, and legitimately opposing points of view, and make a decision on is this good tax policy for the next number of years? Because whatever we do this morning will quite probably result in this policy being in force for some time into the future. So it's an area of tax law that is somewhat...I don't know that if...it's not too complicated for any member of the body, but it's somewhat confusing from time to time in its implementation and application in the state. So I would encourage the members to, with the...recognizing your other "thoughtloads", but to pay attention to this, because it does have a significant impact on the future of the state of Nebraska and on how the resources are gathered together for the...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...support of government services that we provide at the state level, that is the monies that come from state income tax. So with that little editorial comment, thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. We are discussing the Wickersham amendment to the committee amendments. Senator Janssen, on that amendment.
