SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. The committee amendment is a small, technical change. It replaces the term "bowling alley" with the word "bowling center" and reinstates stricken language to allow a bar having a service area of less than 1,200 square foot to be designated smoking area in its entirety. That is all that the committee amendment does. It removes the word "alley" and inserts "center", and then it reinstates a bar with 1,200 square foot as a...of having a smoking area in its entirety. I would move adoption of the committee amendment.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Thompson, I had an amendment to the committee amendments, AM0509, but a note that you want to withdraw this particular one, Senator.

SENATOR THOMPSON: That's correct.
