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SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you. This is consistent with the idea of outlawing the lame duck Congress where officeholders have a tenuous relationship at best with the future of the session and mischief can arise. In fact, we have had mischief occur in whether or not somebody is going to be here for the voting on leadership and on rules and then one day later leave the Legislature and not suffer under either that leadership or those rules but having created mischief for those of us who stayed. And for that reason, I endorse this proposal. I support LR 6CA and intend to vote for it on advancement to E & R Initial.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Landis. Senator Landis, would you yield to Senator Chambers?

SENATOR LANDIS: To the extent that I have any time remaining, I would relinquish it to Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Landis.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I support this but there is one issue that I think needs to be looked at on Select. If a person would decide to relinquish that other office prior to being sworn in, then he or she should not be compelled to resign from the Legislature but that's something that can be worked out. I'm in favor of what the amendment is designed to do, however, so I'm going to vote for its advancement.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Kristensen, there are about a minute and a half left on your closing time if you wish to...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Are there any other lights, Mr. President?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Landis' light is on.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Again, just so the members understand, that this is a constitutional amendment that would require a member of the Legislature, who is in the middle of their term who is elected to any other state or local office that they would have to resign prior to the commencement of the next legislative
