offense. It simply creates the record. And with that, I think we'll go ahead and have the committee amendments brought up. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Baker. Senator Bromm, you are recognized to open on the committee amendments.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Members of the Legislature, LB 410 was heard in the Transportation Committee last February and it had no opponents. It did have some supporters, State Patrol, and McCook Safe Community Committee, and Tri Cities Safe Kids Coalition. There was one neutral testifier. The committee, I think, felt that Senator Baker had a valid proposal. The one thing that seemed frustrating to the committee, and one of the reasons why...I guess the reason why we have a committee amendment is that under the existing language of the law, you never really could get to a second offense, which Senator Baker is trying to make an infraction, because any time you would have a charge, as long you purchased or rented a child restraint system prior to your court appearance, you never...you never had a conviction. So there was...it might be very, very difficult to ever have a second offense. So what this does is that it says that even though you have no points assessed, this is the committee amendment, or any fine imposed, you do have...you do have for purposes of this act a conviction under the first offense. So, therefore, you give rise to a second offense if they violate it again. Outside of that, that's the substantive part of the committee amendment. Other than that, the committee amendment cleans up simply some language that was probably in error, changing an or to an and, and that kind of thing. But other than that, that's the substance of the committee amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. We are now discussing the committee amendments to LB 410. Senator Chambers, you are recognized to speak on the committee amendments.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm still trying to get an understanding of what's happening here, so I want to ask Senator Bromm a couple of questions on the committee amendment.
