

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE
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SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm, do you yield to a question?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes, I would.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bromm, under the current law, what happens to a person who is stopped for not having these...you know, complying with this provision of law?

SENATOR BROMM: They would receive, if they are cited, they would receive a ticket for not having a child restraint system.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, now under this bill, under the committee amendment, what will happen in that instance.

SENATOR BROMM: The same...the same thing at that point.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, I'm with you. Now the new change is going to be when you try to create a second offense.

SENATOR BROMM: Correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, now what is the purpose of creating a second offense?

SENATOR BROMM: The purpose is to try to encourage people after they have failed to use or have a restraint system once to not...to not be a repeat offender or there would be, you know, a consequence for that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, and we're taking it a step at a time. I am not trying to argue.

SENATOR BROMM: No, I...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's just why I am accepting it. What happens when the second offense occurs?

SENATOR BROMM: Under the committee amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.
