SENATOR BROMM: Under the committee amendment, if you do have a second offense, then they are guilty of an infraction, and even though they would go out and buy a child restraint system or rent one, that would not excuse or require dismissal of the ticket as the current law does in the first offense.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And what is the...would there be points taken off?

SENATOR BROMM: There would be no points taken off.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, so it's just, you'd pay the cost of the ticket.

SENATOR BROMM: Correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And court costs, whatever, you pay off the ticket like you would for any infraction but there are no points taken off?

SENATOR BROMM: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And any offense after that is considered what?

SENATOR BROMM: After the second you mean?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Um-hmm.

SENATOR BROMM: Well, this provision says for second or any subsequent offense, so it is the same, whether it's a third or a fourth.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, and I just wanted to have it clear in my mind. And now that I do understand, I don't have any problem with it myself. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Bromm, there are no further lights on, did you wish to close on the committee amendments?
