people understand what we're doing here, this committee amendment does create a first offense, which is on the record. If a person is picked up for a second time without a child restraint system, then they could receive an infraction, a ticket for an infraction under the second offense or subsequent offense, and that would not be excused, that second offense, by going and renting a child restraint system as it would have been under the old law. So that's, basically, the committee amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. The question before the body is, shall the committee amendments be adopted to LB 410? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of committee amendments.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Amendments are adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill at this time, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Redfield, you're recognized to...

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. I am a supporter of this bill but I do have a question for Senator Baker, if he would yield.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker, would you yield to a question please?

SENATOR REDFIELD: Senator Baker, in Section 1, you have changed some language there from "Any person who resides in Nebraska" to "Any person in Nebraska". And I am questioning how this would affect travelers crossing I-80, who are not residents of Nebraska and perhaps may not be meeting the same standards of restraint in their own state. Are you aware if this is the same standard in every state?

SENATOR BAKER: It is fairly uniform. I am not sure about the
