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weight requirements but it's, basically, uniform, yes, according to the information I have.

SENATOR REDFIELD: All right. I would just ask that you might check before we go to Select File. I wouldn't want any traveler or visitor to the state meeting the criteria of their own state to run into a problem here, and if we could just make sure that that reconciles.

SENATOR BAKER: That would be fine, and I will do...I have...I believe I could satisfy your question now. The Nebraska, the Highway Safety Office, Fred Zwonechek, but I will recheck this and make sure.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Redfield. Senator Chambers, you are recognized to speak on LB 410.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Redfield touched on an area of concern that I had, and in view of the exchange she had with Senator Baker and his promise to look into the issue, I will not have further comment on it, but I'd like to be informed also, Senator Baker.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Baker, there are no further lights on. Did you wish to close?

SENATOR BAKER: I'll be very brief. Thank you, Mr. President. I think it's important that we pass this bill. The compliance, as I said before, is roughly 44 percent, or noncompliance, I mean, it's roughly about 44 percent which is, of course, quite higher than the state average of people using restraints. So the children are being neglected here, and I think this is a means to get some attention brought to that fact, and would simply ask for moving this bill on to Select File. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Baker. The question before the body is the advancement of LB 410 to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record, Mr. Clerk.
