deference to the separation of powers doctrine which is constitutional, and to delete the director of the Governor's Policy Research Office from being represented. We also, inadvertently, deleted the State Troopers' Association and Senator Thompson has an amendment which will correct that inadvertent error. There is nothing mysterious about the amendments. I think they simply, with all due respect to the Governor, I think they make for a better study under the control of this body, and I would urge the adoption of the amendments. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Brashear has an amendment to the committee amendment. Senator, I have AM2051 in front of me, just provided to me. It strikes '99 and inserts 2000, Senator.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Brashear.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn.
