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combining carrier enforcement and State Patrol, which is a very definite structural move, if that would ever even be considered or looked at. I don't have a...I don't have an amendment in that regard, but I would ask Senator Thompson if she would yield to a question.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Yes, Senator Bromm.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Thompson?

SENATOR THOMPSON: Yes.

SENATOR BROMM: Senator Thompson, you have been gracious enough to visit with me a little bit about this bill before it came to the floor, and if by Select File there would be a proposition to somehow deal with the proposition of the carrier enforcement issue in this study, would you be amenable to discussing that as another...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...way that this bill could serve the purpose of looking at law enforcement and their duties and responsibilities and organization?

SENATOR THOMPSON: Yes, and I think the language is broad enough to include that now, but if you would like to be more specific, I would be happy to visit with you about that.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay, the language in the original bill you think is specific enough to include some looking at the mission and structure of the carrier enforcement division?

SENATOR THOMPSON: Well, it's all, as I see it, the (1) and (2) on page 2 of the bill,...

SENATOR BROMM: Right.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...assess the current structure and mission, review the growth and viability of mission-related duties, encompasses everything that the State Patrol does. If we want to make sure that that...there is emphasis put on that issue, we
