SENATOR LYNCH: They would be involved in monitoring it, Senator Chambers. In other words, the results of this...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I meant they don't...I meant...

SENATOR LYNCH: No, they don't participate.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Thank you.
