for when the Secretary of State shall cancel a registration from the register in whole or in part. We would enact a new section to provide that the Secretary of State shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations to establish a classification of goods and services, and the classification should conform to the classification adopted by the United States Patent and Trademark Office. We would enact a new section to provide that any person who procures the filing of registration by knowingly making any false or fraudulent representation or declaration is liable for all damages sustained in consequence thereof. Additionally, we would enact two new sections that would provide that any person who uses without consent any reproduction, counterfeit copy or colorable imitation of a registered mark, or any person who reproduces counterfeit copies or colorably imitates a registered mark is liable in a civil action by the registrant to...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...injunctive relief. There would also be a new section to provide that a court of competent jurisdiction may enjoin the manufacture, use, display or sale of counterfeit or imitation...imitations of a registered mark, and the defendant in such an action could be required to pay the owner profits resulting from that wrongful use. There's a new section to provide that actions to require cancelation of a registered mark or actions in mandamus to compel registration of a mark shall be brought in the District Court of Lancaster County, and that's in keeping with other litigation involving the state.
