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SENATOR SCHIMEK: That's correct.

SENATOR KREMER: ...rather than just while they're in the process? So, that would simpli...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Rather than what?

SENATOR KREMER: While they're in the process or even notified that they were going to have some changes or proposed changes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No, all those hearings and all that kind of thing,...

SENATOR KREMER: Right.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...they wouldn't have to file.

SENATOR KREMER: It's just the final...the final product then.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: It's a very scaled down bill now from what it originally was.

SENATOR KREMER: Okay. I think there's some real value to having it centralized, so I would support it.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. We're a little further along. Senator Cudaback said, and he's the principle introducer, he said, look, there's nothing special about this area as compared to other areas, it's just that this was in the zoning area and there was some value and coordinating information in one place. Now, I don't mean to be a conspiracy theorist, but if you take a look at the committee statement, in favor of the bill, the Cattlemen, the Farm Bureau and the Pork Producers Association. In opposition to the bill: NACO, Cass County, Center for Rural Affairs, Nebraska Farmers Union, League of Rural Voters, Nebraska...Mid-Nebraska Pride, and neutral Elaine Thoendel, who's been on all of our e-mails about big livestock production centers and their pollution concerns. This is the traditional fight over large mega hog operations, large livestock
