SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, are there any other lights on, Mr. Speaker?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Not now.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Would you like to...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...close on the committee amendments?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Would you like to count this as your closing?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, please.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Very good, this is the closing on the committee amendments.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The reason I turned my light on was to remind everybody that we are on the committee amendments. What we're asking people to do, no matter how you feel about the bill, is to vote down the committee amendments so that we can then consider the Cudaback amendment. And I was just going to try to expedite the process a little bit. The committee amendment would actually require more reporting than the Cudaback amendment does. And I think, from the discussion on the floor, at least everybody should be supportive of disposing of the committee amendments. So at this time I would ask you to vote red on the committee amendments. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You've heard the closing. The question before the body is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.
