**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** Committee amendments are rejected.

**CLERK:** Mr. President, Senators Cudaback and Schimek would move to amend with AM2058. (Legislative Journal pages 348-350.)

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** Senator Cudaback, do you desire to open, or Senator Schimek? Senator Schimek, you're recognized to open on the Cudaback amendment, your amendment as well, AM2058.

**SENATOR SCHIMEK:** Yes, thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. What this amendment does, if you're looking at the green copy of the bill, is it gets rid of basically lines 7 through 15. It gets rid of the notices of all county planning commission meetings and county boards of commissioners, or board of supervisor meetings involving planning and zoning issues, gets rid of each counties comprehensive development plan, and gets rid of the notices of hearings that shall be filed by the county, and inserts that the system shall include each counties zoning regulations or temporary zoning regulations, and any amendments adopted thereto. And otherwise, otherwise it's basically the same as the original bill. We've just taken out those steps that would require the counties to send in the county zoning plan. And I might say from the conversation, I know little or nothing about zoning. I've never been on a planning commission, I've never served on a county board, I have never really been involved in the process. But from what...the discussion that I heard, it's the comprehensive plans that are really thick, and that would require a lot of expense for people to, particularly the Secretary of State to send out. We're talking about the rules and regulations here. And again, I know it's been stated several times, but I think the vision here is that the Secretary of State's Office would be the central repository, and there would be a web site, eventually, that people could get this information from. So with that, I would simply ask your consideration of the amendment. And, Senator Cudaback, I would be happy to give you the rest of my time.

**SENATOR CUDABACK:** Thank you, Senator Schimek.

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** Senator Beutler. Oh, I'm sorry. Senator Cudaback, she was yielding you the rest of the time? You have
