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approximately seven minutes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I guess Senator Schimek did explain it quite well. There's not really too much to explain. It's pretty much self-explanatory. Again, if it changed zoning, if it did anything other than simply say that the county would send the rules and regs to the Secretary of State's Office, it will be available for all of us, if we wish to contact him and ask. That's simply all it does. There's the special interest groups. I guess there are special interest groups in...of course, I know there are no special interest groups in banking, because I was in banking once and so...anyway, I had to throw that in there. But I guess there are special interest groups in every business, I hope they all...I hope we want to pursue and better ourselves and our business. If we don't, I guess we're in trouble. I wouldn't want a CEO that didn't want to push...I won't mention any big companies, but I hope the Gates of the world push their company. I mean, what else are we doing here? But I'm sure not going to go out and push, if I'm a Microsoft, I'm not going to necessarily go out and push a Dell company. So perhaps Senator Landis is right, maybe they did come down here and testify for the bill because they had an interest in it. I hope they had an interest. Others have interests, that's where we are, that's what the game is about, I guess, looking out for yourself. And in the meantime, and in the meantime, when looking out for yourself, the wagon comes along, you know, and we help others out as well. Simply not for Jim Cudaback, not for the big companies of the world, but hopefully we jump on the bandwagon and it's for all of us. If not, I'll be the first one to come back here and change this bill next year, and you know that. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Kristensen, members of the Legislature, let me just point out one thing and ask you to consider and see what you make of it. But ordinarily, when documents are filed with the Secretary of State, a financing statement, for example, if that financing statement isn't properly filed, then there is no lien on the property.
