SENATOR CUDABACK: And he didn't think he'd have to hire anybody necessarily special just to do this here because it wouldn't involve that much. I don't think counties really change their rules and regs that often. If it was a comprehensive plan and all these big things, yes, perhaps.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Right.

SENATOR CUDABACK: But I think those things won't be filed, simply the rules and regs.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'm going to support this amendment at this point because I don't believe the cost will be onerous. If it turns out, after we move this along and there turns out to be a large A bill on it, I may change my mind. At this point I don't think it hurts to have these centrally located for...so interested people, as well as other counties, can access information. I would agree with Senator Landis, if this had an extraordinary cost, that it probably is superfluous to be doing this when you have access. On the other hand, we have 93 counties eventually doing this. If I have a bill in, don't know whether it will go anywhere this year, but I definitely will bring it back next year. It will mandate all counties to have zoning by 2004. I think it's necessary for counties to move forward in this area. I know it's controversial, I know it's emotional issues in many areas. And I know the livestock confinement issue is one that raises a flag in many minds. My purpose is not really to be directly so much concerned about that issue specifically, as I believe it's important for counties to be looking at where they want to go in the zoning area, bring them up to the year 2000, if you will, because zoning serves many other purposes. It gets people to thinking about their future, it gets them to thinking about where they want those locations in their counties. It has to do if they want industry to move in or if they don't want them to move in. It has to do with protecting agriculture, if they want it to be protected. It has to do with having everyone really understanding and having clear understanding of where their counties should be headed in some kind of a format that has had discussion.
