ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Schimek's amendment, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to. Discussion on the advancement of LB 289? Senator Cudaback, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I guess we've had a good discussion on this bill. And as we all know here, the amendment does become the bill, it becomes the bill. And I would just like to say one thing before I sit down. Some day, if this is not passed today, there will be a centralized place to go for these rules and regs, whether it be with the Secretary of State, whether it be someplace else. And this in no way diminishes the fact that NACO does an excellent job. We are not here debating that issue. They do a great job, they serve a great purpose. I was a member of that body for 12 years, so in no way am I taking away any of their so called thunder. They do a great job. We just felt that perhaps the Secretary of State's Office, they could do the job also. So with that, I guess I will sit down and, I guess, vote your conscience.
