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supporting the bill. And I said, you know, last year in the Education Committee we came up with this amendment; everyone bought off on it, and it was agreed upon, so now what has happened? Well, I think that, like with any other group, a couple of superintendents get on the phone, they call around, and they're looking at the green copy; they aren't looking at the amendment that becomes the bill. In fact, Senator Schrock, the call that you got from the superintendent at Blue Hill, I also got that call. But included in that was, "but I'm looking at the original bill". So, I think it's important, as we begin this process, I hope everyone begins to pay close attention, because if you've been contacted saying that they do not support the bill, many of them have not seen the amendment and what we're doing here that becomes the bill. So it's very important, and that's why I wanted to have my light on. I know that we have a number of papers on our desk. I do believe if you take the time to read the one from the principal at Valley Public Schools, I think that it points out very clearly the support that that principal has and the intent that that principal sees the bill and the worthiness of it. For all of you who have been on boards of education, you know very well the main...two main things for a member on the board of education is to hire and fire the superintendent and to set board policy. This recognizes the importance of setting board policy, and lets every board set the policy that will guide the publications. And so there would be no reason that I could imagine as a board member that I would object to the bill, knowing that I could set the policy at my local...for my local school. That's what you do as a school board member, it's your responsibility. And if you object to that, I would say that then you're objecting to one of the basic, fundamental reasons for being on a board of education. This does nothing to interfere with the authority that that board of education has to set policy. And at the same time, it may restrict some of the...more restrictive than the original bill, but it still does put some responsibility onto the students. If you have board policy and set board policy, and you are a student and you disregard that board policy, then you suffer the consequences, plain and simple, as with any other board policy. So I think that this amendment certainly helps clear up some of the questions that people had. And I hope that you will continue to pay close attention so that we understand the amendments which then, as I said, become the bill. Thank
