if you have a code, you follow your own code; if you fail to make a code, then you follow the outlines in the statute that apply when you don't have a code, which is Section 4, subsection (2), which is, I think, a good policy itself. But...so that's kind of the way it's structured. Now I don't have anything against mandating it. But, as you know, mandating things to school districts is something we try very hard to avoid in this Legislature. But let me...this, I think, is a good time to point out, and I hope you will look at the laws of Kansas, and Iowa, and Colorado, our surrounding states. What does Iowa say? Subsection (4) of Iowa's bill, each board of directors of a public school shall adopt rules in the form of written publications code, and then has language similar to ours. They don't have the alternative of following a statutory structure. They do as you suggest, they mandate that each school district have a publications code. And then a lot of the provisions are similar to what we have, because we picked up a lot from Iowa's law. Kansas, note particularly Kansas. Subsection (d), subject to the limitations, dah, dah, dah, student editors are responsible for determining the news, opinion and advertising content of publications. Teachers are responsible for teaching and encouraging free and responsible expression of material and high standards. This Kansas law is remarkably broad. I mean the good old Midwestern, say it like it is and let's not be afraid of words, here it is. Kansas, Kansas lets those students talk. I haven't done any research on what consequences, if any, in Kansas they've experienced from such a broad law. But I have heard nothing brought up about poor experience in Kansas. But we don't go nearly as far as Kansas. Colorado, subsection (4) in the Colorado law, similar to Iowa. The board of education of each school district shall adopt, shall adopt a written publication code. And here's the other part that appears, both in the laws of...that appears in the laws of these three states and also in our bill, which I think is important, it says, said publication code shall be distributed or otherwise made available to all students and teachers. That to me is the value of all of this, that you're setting a standard ahead of time and you're giving notice to all involved that these are the rules of the game. You know, there's nothing more American than saying to the people you regulate, these are the rules of the game. It's one of those principles of fundamental fairness that we would...
