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I was privileged, many, many years ago, to be the editor of our school paper for two years. I don't know why two years; I think it was probably some form of punishment but, nonetheless, for two years. And it was an interesting experience. And it was an experience that taught a person responsibility, among other things, because journalism is, in fact, an honorable profession, but, as all elements of society, it is not a profession that allows you license to do anything that you want to do. I, for an example, as a professional in food production, cannot do everything that I want to do, particularly if it impacts upon my neighbors and the other members of the community. There are restraints that we learn in the issue of maturing and growing into becoming good citizens. My problem with LB 182 is not whether or not a school is overly restrictive or not overly restrictive, it appears to me, in recollection, to have grown out of what we would have defined, in my time, as a certain type of contest between a journalism teacher and administrative folks in that school that has grown into being an issue of state policy. So I would ask you this then with all of that preamble, is it the need of this body...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...to micromanage school systems? Is or is not this an issue that would best be decided within a community, based upon what was acceptable in that community and met the standards that the parents expected of that system for their students, recognizing, of course, the Supreme Court decision, which I quite frankly believe that both journalism instructors, through in-service training, and superintendents and principals, through all of the meetings, are well aware of the constraints that are placed upon them in the issue of free speech. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, Mr. President and members. Senator Brashear, I would...as we have stated, you did a great deal of work in writing the amendment.
