because they have become spoiled in thinking they can get anything from this Legislature they want, and think they can kill anything they want, I'm going to see whether the county attorneys can get another bill through this Legislature while I'm here. That's how deeply I feel about what it is they did. And why do I say they did it? Because of the flippant comments that some of them made in the newspaper. They did not mind it being known, so I am accepting their challenge. Whether or not the death penalty will ever be abolished in Nebraska will await future events. But a society should grow, it should mature. It should become more civilized. And the state, those who administer the instrumentalities of the state, those who exercise the powers and prerogatives of the state should certainly display and manifest, by their conduct and the policies put in place, the standards that society should comply with. When the state says that it must kill and that it shall kill, there should be no surprise that killing is engaged in by the populace at large, and that will continue to be the case. Senator Bruning, on the one hand, talked about the reasons that people who support the death penalty support it. Then he turned right around and talked about the numbers of people in his district who support it, which converts it from a principled position to one of politics. And that is a reason that a politician may use for voting or not voting on an issue. But as I stated before and I'll state again, I pay attention to what happens in society and not just on this floor. And I have a record, and I am going to continue to expand on it, of dealing with those issues that others see but won't touch. Some people think that Senator Aguilar is going to have to handle all of the issues of Latinos, Chicanos, Hispanics, Mexican-Americans, all of those who are put in those various categories, but he is not even aware of the bills and the things that I have done on this floor for those groups of people. Women are not aware of the things that I've done on this floor to help women. And I'll continue to...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...do those things because my conduct should be an example of what it is that I say I believe in, and I will not hide behind, well, people in my district don't like this. Do you think people in my district like same-sex marriage?
