row, those six people who are sitting there, having been convicted of. And they certainly don't want to give them another bite at the apple, and perhaps the State Constitution wouldn't do that, but I don't know what the federal courts might do. And so I think with those reservations, that's really the reason why people are voting, or some of the reasons they are voting on this issue. And as much as I respect Senator Chambers, I will not, no matter who opposes me, whatever group opposes me on bills, and there certainly have been groups, traditionally, oppose me on certain things, I will not ever tell them you will never get another piece of legislation through as long as I'm here. For one thing, if the body has a will, it can pass legislation over Senator Chambers' objections. So it is a hollow threat. He can make it very, very difficult, but if the body has the will, you can pass what you want to pass. Secondly, I don't think that's fair. I don't think that's fair.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: I think any group, whether it is a women's group, whether it is the county attorneys, whether it is the NSEA, whether...whether, I don't care what it is, they should always have the right to come forward with their position and not be intimidated and feel that they will never get another law passed if they oppose a certain law or support a certain law. That is not the way we operate in this state nor should we. And this body has got to have the will to do what's right regardless of who is supporting or opposing a bill. And I think, I think we will. I am very, very impressed with the composition of this body. Since I've been in this Legislature, I've not seen a finer group of senators who express themselves as thoughtfully as I heard in this debate today, and I hope we can continue with that kind of...
