Senator Bromm, there are some things on this bill that you are not aware of. Did you know that the county attorneys did not oppose this bill before the committee? The Attorney General did not oppose it. They were so sure that the Judiciary Committee would work their will and they said in the newspaper we were so sure the committee would kill it we didn't even have to show up. That's how sure they are, Senator Bromm. Now I cannot stop them from trying to offer a bill and I would not try. Would I try to intimidate 93 people, one little me try to intimidate 93 county attorneys? Certainly not, Senator Redfield. But I will fight them, and I read what they said in the paper, and when Senator Bromm said that people thought about these things and came to their own conclusions, that's not completely correct, Senator Bromm, because not only did I read a handout of Senator Bourne's, but he stated that that was what caused him to have some of the opinions he had, things he heard read that Gary Lacey said. So Senator Bromm didn't pay as close attention to my colleagues as I did. Now that brings me to an interesting question. Did I really believe that the Legislature would pass a bill such as this? Did I really believe it? Well, as General Patton said, that's for me to know and you to speculate about. But I will tell you what, it gives me an opportunity to discuss the matter of lethal injection, and this is one thing I will tell you and I've told you before and you are going to be stampeded by your Governor, if he can do it, when people are sentenced under a specific law to die and the method of execution is set forth in that law, you cannot come up with a different method of execution and apply it to those people, so all of their sentences, they will all be resentenced. You cannot kill them. So whether you pass a legal injection bill this year in a special session, or whenever the Governor is going to ruffle you all and make you run and do it, Senator Matzke probably didn't know this, and I know Senator Bruning didn't know it because he told a reporter that the Director of Corrections would establish the method of execution. I read the law. I know the law and we're all grown people, and when we say things, I'm going to expose it. Jesus said that which is whispered in the closet will be shouted from the housetop; those things done in secret will be noised abroad. Well, do the same thing to me. I welcome people quoting me and you will raise the level of discussion automatically by quoting me. So now since we know that people are so worried about changing the law with
