Then when an issue is raised of the kind that I'm raising, people can say, oh, these are just being reappointed, it has nothing to do with gender. Well, they've taken care of that already by the foundation that they built, and it's why I have to be alert, attentive and have to be the only voice, since there will be no other, calling attention to these things, not only with reference to these appointments, but other things. When a particular interest group controls a system, it is obvious and of surprise to no one that such group is going to structure everything to benefit themselves. And once that structuring has been consented to or acquiesced in, they have a machine that's moving and can perpetuate itself, and that discriminatory system will continue to be perpetuated. There are people in South Carolina who are flying the flag of traitors. That Confederate flag, the stars and bars, do not just indicate they believe in slavery and the inferiority of black people. It means that they believe the flag of a traitorous, treacherous, would-be nation, Revolutionists, if you want to call them that to dignify them, have the right to fly their Rebel flag with the United States flag. Now the United States flag, to me, ought to come down, because for me, as a black man, the United States flag is a bigger symbol of oppression than the Confederate flag, because before there was a Confederacy and a Confederate flag, there was a United States flag and there was a United States Constitution. And the only provision in the United States Constitution which could not be amended, based on the terms of the Constitution, nothing about saying you can't take away free speech, nothing that said you cannot take away freedom of religion, nothing that said you cannot take away the right to vote, nothing that said you cannot create a monarchy, none of that. You could do that under the U.S. Constitution, if you got the amendments to do it. There is only one thing that was so sacred, so essential and fundamental to what America was then and what America is now was that the slave trade could not be touched for a certain period of years, and that provision and that provision alone was not subject to be amended. That's what is in this Constitution that somebody once referred to as an agreement with hell and a compact with the devil. So a flag that means great things to other people and will cause their little hearts to flutter with joy...
