can comment on that himself. You couldn't do it to me. Now much of what he said is correct about what happens in families--arguments, disagreements. There might be a dominant person, there might be a submissive person and we don't know the gender of which, necessarily, because it will vary from relationship to relationship. And, believe it or not, it varies sometimes within a relationship. He mentioned that judges don't always have the time to really understand thoroughly the situation, and I won't disagree with that. He mentioned the...that there will be people in a relationship who will argue and do silly things, and I agree. One may just decide to say it's not worth this aggravation, I'll just go along to get along, and I agree. If that is the nature of these relationships, why should the state get into it and dictate what this relationship is going to be? Our discussion shows the sensitivity of this area of relationships and exactly why the state ought to stay out of it. If I haven't conducted myself in a way toward my former wife that she wants to allow me to have as much time with the children as I choose to have, that's on me. If I hate her but I love my children, you know what I can do for my children? I can die and go to hell ten times for my children. And if I really love my children, as some of the people on this floor are talking about people loving their children, that woman would wonder why she divorced me, because she would say, I've never had a man treat me with the respect, with the consideration that Ernie is showing me now. If he had done all this, we wouldn't have ever gotten married (sic). But instead I want to be able to snarl at her and call her a bitch, you were a bitch when we were married, and that is what you are now. But I got the law, I got the law, and you can tell the court I said that, but you know that in my position the court is not going to believe you. The court is not going to believe that a man of my stature and morality would say such a thing. If anything, it will be a reflection on you. And I will tell the court this shows how you lie. Now you all think situations like that don't happen? You think there are not big shots who get hold of children in this way and don't even intend to take care of them, they're going to put them in day care? I sat in an appellate court proceeding the other day and saw a terrible situation arise where the judge was unfair, a lower court judge, but there's a chance it can be corrected where a ne'er-do-well moved the child when he wasn't supposed to.
