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it should...needs to be stronger, then do that. I think you have a pretty good group of people on the council. The other thing you see, am I correct, the Governor appoints the council? Nothing to stop anyone from going to the Governor and being careful of who is appointed, of whom is appointed, who's appointed (laugh), of the people that are appointed to that council. You have to watch. Again, I'm telling you, when you pass this bill you have a responsibility to watch and see that it's going to work the way you think it will, and if it's not working come back and do something about it. I think DiAnna Schimek would do the same thing herself. If she...if, in two years, if she felt like it wasn't doing what she wanted it to do originally, she'd try and look at it and go to the Health Department and go to this group and say we want to try and change something. I'm not beating the drum so much for the bill as I am for common sense when it comes to what we look at in health. The health business these days, and it is a business, is in what I feel is disarray, and anything we can do to help the people who are involved every day....I have a box this high from Blue Cross/Blue Shield full, things that I'm still not sure I always understand. This is a...if you read any of them you...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...begin to wonder sometimes. But, at any rate, because of that, you see, anything we can do to help the people who are responsible for people who have long-term care, short-term care, rehabilitation, whatever, there are women out there who have been hurt in accidents whose health problems will be entirely different than a woman, a young woman, of the same age who is going to have a family and so on. I have some experience with that too, so all I'm asking you this morning is use your common sense on this bill and hopefully we can help women as we go along, women, men and families, because the woman so often is the person who is the caregiver and the one who...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...is the strong person in the family. Thank you.
