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So that's how I feel about that particular issue but again,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...because of the advice that I have gotten from women, who are medically and professionally involved every day in medical ethics, I will support LB 480. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN PRESIDING

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature. The discussion on boards and commissions, I might add a little bit to that. The Government Committee, under the direction of Senator Schimek, this summer and fall started putting together trying to find boards and commissions that we felt as though were inactive. Over 200 were sent out to the different boards that we could find nothing about them or they were inactive, and through that process, when they would send, some of them that would send something back, explain what their...what their function was and why they were there and so on and so forth, so I just want everyone to know that there is something being done now to try to eliminate some of them. If we can't find anybody who is serving on them or they're inactive, they need to be...they need to be eliminated, in my opinion, and that is happening now. So, yes, we do put a lot of boards and commissions out there but, yes, we do have a process now that is going to take care of those inactive commissions or whatever they're...for whatever reason they were intended to be put into place. So I, yeah, I don't...I don't see anything wrong with Senator Stuhr's amendment. If she's comfortable with that, I would be too. It can always be put back into place again, you know, like Senator Hartnett said, that we never have a sunset. Well, in some cases you don't, but to my knowledge nothing has ever been done about it and, thanks to Senator Schimek and the Government Committee, there is something being done and it will be...they will be reviewed periodically now and if they are inactive it will be eliminated. It's a good process and I thank Senator Schimek for doing this. And so I, you know, I'll probably support the sunset, although I don't believe it is necessary, but if that is Senator Stuhr's wishes, why, I would
