SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature. The reason, main purpose, that I did introduce the amendment was to give some time for review, and I would like to respond to Senator Chambers' remark that...and just say that many bills, and I think that most of us know that, that state some boards, possibly some councils, and they clearly have a termination date within the bill and we, I think, are being more careful in how we are writing bills, that we include that they shall exist for a year or possibly two years, and I think that's because of the review that...and the concern that we have for the various boards and commissions. So that was one reason that I introduced the amendment, again, to give some opportunity. I believe four years is ample time. Possibly we'll want to change the number that is on the council. Possibly we'll want some different people who are maybe more apt to find some additional funding in this area. It gives us an opportunity to look and to review, and I would ask for your support. Thank you.
