SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you, Madam Chairman. And she said, since so many counties are in the process of zoning now, that she had numerous requests from counties to give them information that she had on the zoning in Hamilton County, which has been in place for many years and has been working real well. And it has taken her a lot of time, but she had no objection to helping them do that. And I asked her if it would be helpful if it would be in a central...centralized place, and she said if it would be on the Internet, a web page where someone could browse and find out something that would be of interest to them, they would probably still call the county because they have a tendency to like to have a dialog where they could one-on-one ask questions and have an answer, rather than just reading it on hard copy. So they would probably call, but it would probably save a lot of people from calling if they could get, instead of just going to every county and finding out everything that they had, they could pick it out from the Internet.
