SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Senator Beutler, thank you. I was doing something else, so I didn't hear everything. Of course, I think you presented it correctly. I just want to clarify one thing that you and I did not have an opportunity to clarify, and that is that we will be asking the body to vote down the committee amendments rather than withdrawing them. But we can proceed on that basis, as I understand it. I've discussed it with Senator Chambers, he will withdraw the motion to reconsider, and we are prepared to go forward, seeking the defeat of the committee amendment so that we can move to the Beutler-Brashear amendment. With that, I would return my time, Mr. Chairman, to the extent it's necessary to Senator Beutler's comment.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Chambers, did you want to comment on the scenario?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, some of what's in this amendment that I was given this morning is not what Senator Beutler and I had talked about. And I see a provision in this new amendment that is very similar to what I opposed in the committee amendment, which talks in different terms about trying to bring some kind of equality in the time that these people have, and it would be on page...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...2 of that amendment, in lines 18 through 22, specifically line 20, where it talks about the time. So this amendment is not really, as it's drafted here, addressing the concerns that I had, and I just want Senator Beutler to know that.
