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hire lawyers to go back for modifications year in and year out. It may be good for those of us that practice in that area, but it is not good for the kids. And so I'm not...I'm going to vote for the Chambers' amendment, it's one way of making it better. There's a variety of other things, I'd strike out quite a few of those. I would look and say, if you do want to make some steps in this case, eliminate the requirement that they both have to agree,...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Time.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: ...and just let the courts decide.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator Crosby, you're recognized to speak to the Chambers amendment to the amendment, followed by Senator Beutler.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I'm probably the culprit, Senator Chambers, when it comes to having this amendment changed, because I did feel that we were again, even the committee amendments, I was apprehensive about the committee amendments when they came out because we were putting detail into the statute. And when you start differentiating between the ages of children and so on, you're putting a detail, under four years old. What about a family that has an eight-year-old, a five-year-old and a three-year-old? Then you have one child here, that's three, that you're supposed to do something different for, and the other two you can do something else. So, from that point of view, I just didn't feel that that was a good thing to put into the amendment. The second thing I will say, yes, it is my bill, I introduced it, no one ever prioritized it. It came out of committee and probably sat there all year. Well when the bill comes along and it's on the floor, when you've introduced a bill you have an obligation to defend and promote that bill, so that's what I'm trying to do, because there is a perceived problem by noncustodial parents and some of their families. The grandparents get involved. Everyone gets involved because they feel that they are left out of the family circle. It may not even be a big decision about education, or what vacation they take, or what camp they go to, it's simply that feeling of I...you have heard...you have listened to those noncustodials tell you stories about how emotional it is to go
