our children, but there was a certain way that we were supposed to love them. And we didn't show our love through those little bonding processes of day-to-day life, but the young fathers of today are. And they are not just going to be upset, they are going to be in revolution, when you continue to have a process that says, okay, now your relationship with that child is going to be seriously curtailed, both in a physical sense and in a legal sense. And remember, this works both ways. There will be many, many cases where the father is not to blame for the divorce in any way, just as in many, many cases the women is not to blame. So you can't have a system that fits all. And you can complain about the fact that the burden on the courts is great, but the alternative to that is no rights for the noncustodial parent. And that system will not bear the pressure of what's happening in society today. And so we need to make changes, I don't know how fast, but we need to keep making them. And this bill that is before you today is very important. I don't think you can just turn your face against it and say this is too tough, because the pressure is building. Every year that there is another young father who is more closely bonded to the children,...
