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in the law that requires both parents to agree. But any change that we make, and Senator Bromm and I were discussing this, this morning, when we talked about maybe striking the existing language, every case pending in court right now could be reopened for the purpose of seeking joint custody. And if there was hostility, if there was vindictiveness, if there was disappointment because sole custody was given to one rather than the other, this gives that disappointed, angry or vindictive one the opportunity to get some revenge. Even if joint custody is not granted, he or she is no worse off than currently, but they had a chance to get their revenge. They could put that custodial parent through the wringer. Or they could say, this is what I can do, because the law was changed, but if we can come to some kind of arrangement on child support, then I'll back off. I'm not willing to open that. And I know that noncustodial parents have been bringing pressure on various senators, but that's not enough to make me say that the law ought to be worsened and I ought to put something in it just so they'll stop coming around or to make them feel good. The area of domestic relations is a difficult one in the law. When I was in law school, many, many years ago, they may have just been awakening to the fact that law schools should teach courses and I think the title at that time was simply "Domestic Relations". They may have subdivided it now into other aspects or various aspects of domestic relations. But for us, with the approach we're taking, to throw the law into chaos is not something I'm willing to do. As I see these amendments coming, and I believe they are offered in good faith, I just don't think they're wise. I think what needs to be done is to take this bill to a cloture vote, and that will be a way to test how much support it has and how much the body is willing to continue grappling with this. Some have suggested that I use a modicum of whatever it would take to let it go to Select File and we try to work things out as it sits there a while. Naturally, I'm wondering why I have to make the grand concession? This is like "Star Trek", I mean we got the "Grumbletonians", or whoever those people are who go throughout the galaxy creating problems, and here they are, air raid against me in my little starship. And they say, Senator Chambers, we want to negotiate with you in good faith. And I say, okay, I can call you up on my screen, you can call me on your screen, and let us negotiate in good faith. And they say, no, for you to show good faith, you have to drop your protective
