properties, and that is why we introduced...that is why I introduced this bill, and I believe that is why the majority of the Judiciary Committee supports the bill. And as I said, there are several amendments pending, of which I am in agreement of, and at this time I will stop, and we will proceed to those.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you, Senator Hilgert. (Visitors introduced.) Mr. Clerk, motions.

CLERK: Mr. President, if I may, one announcement prior to that and that's General Affairs Committee will have an Executive Session at eleven o'clock in Room 2022; General Affairs, eleven o'clock. Mr. President, a priority motion. Senator Chambers would ask unanimous consent to bracket LB 175 until March 15, 2000.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The request for unanimous consent to bracket until March 15th. Are there any objections?

SENATOR HILGERT: I object.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator Hilgert. Objections being heard, Senator Chambers, do you wish to open on your motion?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Brashear and I had talked about this bill last session, and he had worked out some amendments that would have made the bill less onerous than it is. But there is no form of this bill that I will agree with, and I don't think that Senator Bra...let me ask Senator Brashear a question, so that I won't put words in his mouth. Senator Brashear, would you answer a question?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator Brashear, will you yield?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, Mr. President.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Brashear, was there ever any understanding on your part that if those amendments were adopted that I would then support the bill?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: No, there was no such understanding.
