SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Brashear, you are next to speak.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you, Madam Chairman, members of the body. I wanted to rise just briefly, and Senator Quandahl, I hadn't heard his speech before I heard his speech, of course, and he has handled it. But I did want to make the point that because the bracket came up rather immediately, what we didn't do is discuss the committee amendments, and to the extent that I have heard people discussing the bill and the provisions of the green copy of the bill on the floor, and some of those things that have been discussed have seemed too limited, or too restrictive, or unfair, or burdensome, I think if you will glance at the committee amendments, that's exactly where your Judiciary Committee was going was, for instance, taking the five to seven days and turning it into no less than ten and no more than fourteen days. Instead of letting the \$250 become \$1,000, we placed it at \$500, which was the moderate, middle point. We worked through...we worked throughout the bill to make it more reasonable and fair to both sides and so that it would, in fact, we thought serve the interests of both sides. And I don't know what the course of all this will be. I would not vote for the bill in the form it is without the committee amendments, but with the committee amendments, I certainly would, and subject to hearing good arguments on the floor that would point out the necessity for more amendments, and I just wanted to make the point that the green copy really isn't where the committee was going. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Senator Hilgert, you are recognized to speak.

SENATOR HILGERT: Thank you, Madam President, and thank you, Senator Brashear, to rise and speak to the committee amendments. I think that that point should not be lost on the body. The committee amendments do improve the bill. Senator Bourne's amendment does address the one month to two month deposit. Senator Quandahl's amendment does change issuance to service. These amendments improve the bill. I would like to have the opportunity to have this bill amended by the Judiciary Committee, by interested parties. The amendments have been filed. I think they are valid ones and, frankly, if you support
