In fact, when landlord-tenant bills were first brought to the Legislature after I got here, I would always be the one who called attention to the fact of what was...what it was going to do to the tenants. See, not every tenant is a deadbeat, but I'd bet proportionately you might find more lawyers who are absentee, who are exploiters, and a lot of them have property in my district, and the city will not make them take care of these dilapidated houses. The city will not make them cut down the weeds. So we live in that and it appears that here you have a community of people who don't care what their community looks like. Well, I don't know of many people who are on the floor of this Legislature who would saw wood and drive nails home to fix up a dilapidated house which is not theirs, who is going to go around cutting weeds and clearing lots of debris, when it is not their property. And it seems, doesn't it, that the city would enforce antilitter laws and weed laws and condemn these houses. Then after they have had that condemn sign for a certain amount of time, tell the owner you've got to cut it, you got to demolish it, or the city will do it and will charge you. That's what would happen in other parts of the city. So when they come in here and put up a pitiful mouth for these landlords, I'm not the one for them to do it on, and Walt knows it, that I am not going to give an inch on this bill. So I don't care whether we spend the time on the committee amendment, on Senator Hilgert's amendment, Senator Bourne's amendment, or Senator Quandahl's amendment. Any one of them is an occasion of mine. Withdraw my bracket motion? Perish the thought, young man. We're going to have a chance to see how many intend to stay for the eight hours, and here's what you ought to do in taking this vote. If you vote against the bracket motion, you should be willing to vote for cloture. You should because I promise you, as I promised on the rules, I told you then, I don't stand and make a promise on the floor if I don't intend to keep it. I promised you that those rules changes were not going to go anywhere, and I said, that's a promise, and I can get the transcript and show you. Well, the promise I'm giving you on this bad bill is that it's not going to go anywhere unless you get a cloture vote successfully. Here's something that Senator Hilgert and the others could do, if they want to. They could put a lot of amendments up there before we get to any amendment of mine, and I couldn't offer another amendment, but then I wouldn't have to,
