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would I? Because I'd spend all the time discussing theirs. They can't win, and I was against this bill all the way through. It got out of committee because it was never to be considered on the floor of the Legislature. You know, I've talked about trash legislation and they will kill it but not now. Well, committees have a practice sometimes of advancing a bill with the expectation that it's not going to go anywhere, but it comes back to haunt. I am the one, though, who will fight it on the floor like I tried to fight it in committee. So you ought to look at all those who voted for this bill in committee and expect to see them on the floor defending it, and telling you why...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM PRESIDING

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...you ought to be willing to stay here and give all that time because this is such an important bill. I don't do this on every bill, and there are bills that I support very strongly, like the women's initiative bill. And it would take more than a call from HHS to get me to change my vote. But then I'm an elected official. I was elected not selected, and even the people in my district who voted for me don't pull my chain and say change your vote. I've got a lot I think I can talk about. I hope you vote down this bracket motion. I'm just getting on a roll now. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to close on your bracket motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This reminds me of something that happened, and I won't mention the person, but this individual wound up being president as a result of being appointed president. So he was being criticized and attacked mercilessly for his policies and lack of policies and, finally, one of the attackers said, buddy, you wasn't even elected president. And he said, that's what ought to make you think I'm great. Anybody can be elected but I'm the guy who got to be president without being elected. So that's even greater. Brothers and sisters, sometimes this legislative floor becomes a caldron. It gets very hot, and it was in a political context they said, if you can't stand the
