SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The house is under call. Will all unexcused senators please return to the Chamber. Will all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Will all unexcused members please return to the Chamber. Will all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Senator Bromm, would you please check in. Senators Brown and Preister, if you are in the building, would you please check in. Senator Dierks, if you are in the building, would you please check in, Senator Dierks. Senator Preister, if you are in the building, would you please check in. Senator Dierks? Is Senator Dierks in the building? Senator Chambers, we are unable to locate Senator Dierks. We have some indication Senator Dierks has been found. We'll wait just a moment. Senator Dierks has been found. The motion is to bracket LB 175 to March 15th, 19...2000; 1999 would be kind of a reverse vote, wouldn't it, 2000, thank you. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed nay. Have you all voted? A record vote has been requested. Record.

CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal page 469.)
3 ayes, 30 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to bracket the bill.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The motion fails. Next item on the bill, Mr. Clerk. I will raise the call. Thank you.

CLERK: Mr. President, I believe Senator Brashear has yet to open on the committee amendments to the bill.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator Brashear, you are recognized to open on the committee amendments.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. The committee amendments are extensive. I am going to try to summarize them for you. The committee amendment, first of all, strikes Section 1, deleting the provision of the bill that would increase the amount that a landlord can require as a deposit for guide dogs. Your committee thought that that should be deleted. That's the first section of the amendment. Sections 2 and 3 are amended to change the amount of abandoned personal property that may be disposed of without a public sale. The bill would have increased the amount of abandoned personal
