SENATOR CHAMBERS: Um-huh.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Probably not, they'd probably bring themselves and testify themselves as to what the value is.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And they would be hoping that they will be believed and their word would be accepted over whatever is presented by the other side.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: That's probably true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: More or less. Thank you, Senator Quandahl. And, members of the Legislature, I'm just going through this to show that there are problems with the existing law and why I'm not going to just take the time and talk about nothing, not on this bill, not on these issues. They are extremely important, and the law that I am talking about now is in place right now. Nothing proposed in LB 175 changes it, nothing in any amendment that I've offered thus far proposes to change it, but I'm trying to show why this bill cannot be allowed to go as far as I'm concerned. And I'm going to do...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...everything I can to stop it. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. The question is the Chambers amendment to FA275 to LB 175. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Record vote has been requested. Have you all voted? Mr. Clerk, please record. I acknowledged a record vote, Senator Chambers.

CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal page 487.)
0 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President, on the amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is not agreed to. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Chambers would move to reconsider the vote just taken, Mr. President.
