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to me everybody fits that description, but some are younger than others even, and prevail. But here is the thing that needs to be considered, which issues are significant enough to justify the war of wills? It is significant enough to me on LB 175 to take all the time necessary to stop it because it is doing things that are so pernicious, but it is not significant enough, in terms of trying to get LB 175 passed, to go through that. I'm speaking objectively now, even though I don't like the bill. And even though I put the legislators in a bind yesterday by vising 30 people's mind and making them vote against a motion that they knew they should have voted for, I forgive you. I'm persuasive. I have that power to cloud men and women's minds so that they cannot see that which is rational and ought to be done. That's what I'm doing now. I am conducting this discussion in such a way as to compel you to vote against everything that I bring. But by the same token, I am putting things into the record so that, when the no votes are reviewed, people will be able to see what you voted against, the things that you felt ought to continue the way they are, and one of them is to let a landlord keep a person's property simply on the basis of a belief. I will get around to going after that word. But what I may do is see whether Senator Quandahl or Senator Hilgert has an amendment to this portion of the committee amendments and allow them to offer an amendment before I put more on this particular section. Where is Senator Hilgert? Is he here? Does anybody know whether Senator Hilgert has an amendment to the second division? From my best information, he does not. Oh, here he is. Senator Hilgert, do you have a proposed amendment to the second division, the one we're on now,...
