That's where the fury comes from, and it's blinding and all-consuming. And the wars go on and on, even when people no longer remember what the cause of the war was or what they're fighting for. Now all they know is if your colors are blue and red or mine are green and gold, whenever I see blue and red I'm going to kill whoever is behind that. And that one says wherever I see something blue and gold, that's what I'm going to kill. And they are allowed to have the field. So I'm going to use these opportunities, when I get them, to put things into the record, discuss those issues that need to be discussed that otherwise would not. It's only in the context of one of these extended debates that such conversation can take place.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time. Senator Chambers, this will be your third time, Senator Chambers, coming up. You're recognized. This will be your third time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Senator Hilgert reminded me that Margaret Thatcher is alleged to be a woman. (Laugh) He didn't say "alleged", he said she is. Senator Hilgert, remember, I was mentioning certain negative traits and said, do they apply only to the Irish? I said, no, they apply to every group; every group has those among their numbers, even women. So I cover my tracks. But what can happen? The microcosm can be on a legislative floor, it can be one person against whom every person's hand is raised, and that one person raises his or her hand against everybody else. And the Bible talked about that. I won't give you the character about whom it was stated, he shall raise his hand, his hand shall be raised against every man, every man's hand shall be raised against him. All of those nice things in the Bible. Why do I quote it? Because it's as good for making points as Greek and Roman mythology. So right next to Greek and Roman mythology, I place Jewish and Christian mythology, the Old Testament and the New Testament are mythology. Why do I say they're mythology? When I was a child I was taught that if you have multiple gods, that's myth. Well Christians have multiple gods. I was taught that if you have monsters and creatures that talk like people, that's mythology, because animals don't talk. Well there was a guy who was called a prophet of God, and he was going to go where God didn't want him to go. His name was Balaam. So he was going to walk...he was on this ass, a jackass, and he had to pass under an archway
