upon the Legislature to vote against its own interests. You get them to looking off somewhere else, and then they do the thing you want them to do. But because of the way human nature operates, or human psychology, or conditioning, people in a bad circumstance will accept that. They will begin to believe that this is the way things are supposed to be. And they will allow things to continue to happen to them, and they begin to identify with the one who is harming them. Because they identify with the oppressor, they become snitches, informants and stool pigeons. They will rat out those among their own number who are trying to put together a plan or an approach that can bring them some freedom. So in most situations where there is an oppressed group and they are trying to lay out a plan to get freedom, among them will always be found stool pigeons and informants who will run to the oppressor and tell him. And think that by telling they will somehow ingratiate themselves individually with the oppressor and be given a consideration that their own kind will not. They begin to feel that they have it bad because their own kind are the problem. And they believe their own kind are the problem because the oppressor teaches them that. That's the way it is with black people in this country and other minorities. That's the way it is with women in this country who are a majority. Women do have a lot in common and they should get together. But all that has to be done is to pick one or two over here and give them a little something, and they become the underminers of everything that would benefit women. They become the ones who will attack any program that will give women strength and power and the ability to use their numbers to bring about changes that ought to be made. So they get divided and get to running off in all kind of directions and saying the things that the oppressive white man wants them to say against the efforts of other women. And they are so frightened, so beaten down, so intimidated that they will not resist. They just go along. And if you gave them a deeper voice and cut their hair...
