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again. Do you think he would want to offend people out there who might work against him? Now he might be a neophyte, but anybody in politics or who has read about politics knows you don't do that. What about Senator Hilgert? Well, Senator Hilgert is an old-timer, so maybe the same things don't apply to him. But I don't want to get any of my colleagues in trouble with the lobby. I will not do that. That is the unpardonable violation. But because I don't do it on this bill doesn't mean I won't do it on some other bill. And I will ask them questions and have them stand up time and time again and say, I simply refuse to answer, or stay in their chair like a knot on a log and don't say anything and we'll just presume from their silence that they intend not to answer. But I think on a bill like this many things have to be cleared off the deck. I'm going to say again, because I see some people here who haven't been here in the past, they've been circling around but they weren't in here, I talked to "Senator" Radcliffe. I heard an owl making a cry from Senator Bourne's chair and the owl was "who"? Anyway, I talked to "Senator" Radcliffe, pointed out that the worst thing in the bill to me was where they were shortening the amount of time that tenant has to take legal action, to make it clear that this process is to be challenged, this procedure is to be challenged. He said three days. I guess he felt like that because that's how long Jonah was in the whale and another person supposedly was in the earth. But they're wrong on that too, Senator Bourne. Now I don't know about Jonah, because they don't say the day he went in or the day he came out. They just tell us three days and we have to take it on faith. But as for that other person they talk about, the crucifixion was on Friday night, based on what they say. That's one night. He was in the ground Saturday. That's one day. He was in the ground Saturday night. That's two nights. He got up Sunday morning. So something doesn't compute. He was not in the ground three days or three nights. And they say over and over, as the Son of Man was three days and three nights in the heart of the earth, so shall...and then they mention all kind of other things. So that...that's the mythology that we all know is there. But the point that I'm getting to in this discussion is that "Senator" Radcliffe said three days, that's it. I said that's...what's the minimum number you'd go for? Three. I told him, then we'll leave the bill where it is, and it was...his reaction was one of those kind of shrugs of so be it, and that is why we're here.
