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from running for Attorney General. That's a right to anyone who meets other qualifications of residency, and so forth. But I believe that it's all, the bill and the discussion this morning has been based on behavior, and simply removing any identity will not serve the intended purpose of the bill. Thank you, and I yield back the remainder of my time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature. If we were to adopt this...this measure, I don't think you're going...you would see unqualified people running for office. You'd see the same caliber of people that you always do. You know, you talk about philosophy. You know, what would you rather have? Someone who his philosophy upsets a lot of people, or would you rather have someone who is a good attorney, a good attorney and someone who will listen to people's concerns. And, again, I am not saying that...I am not talking about any particular individual. I'm looking into the future, and I'm sure that this concern was brought on this floor prior to 1937. The country or the state, I'm sure, when we got rid of the two-party system in our Unicameral, thought the world was going to or the state was going to go to hell in a handbasket. Well, it didn't happen. We're still here. We're still operating. We're still doing, in my opinion, a better job than any other form of state government. There are people who will argue against that. The problem I have, as Senator Schmitt alluded to, more so in county offices you see this happen when someone can't vote for a candidate. You have two Democrats running in the primary, and that's all you have. The Republicans cannot vote. They can at the general election, but they can't in the primary. Sometimes you see people jumping back and forth just so they can cast their vote for a certain individual. I think that's wrong. I think that when it comes to law enforcement, which the Attorney General is the big cheese law enforcement officer in this...in this state, I think everyone, everyone should have a chance to vote for those particular individuals who they believe can be the leader of our law enforcement agency in this state. That's the reason that I cast a ballot in favor of putting Senator Chambers' bill out to the floor for discussion. I can see the other constitutional officers maybe...it may be politically correct to have them on a
