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\$150,000 of the Revolving Fund authority would be required on an annualized basis. And then staff is going to tell me something here too.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I agree.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Just a minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I didn't have...I don't have that updated fiscal note, I guess.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I've just heard back from the lobby. SOS is very extensively used.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yeah.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: We haven't had any comments on that. I thought it might be appropriate for everyone to know that.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yeah.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I wasn't sure, but I thought it was.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I will support this. I think...I think it is working well. We haven't heard any complaints recently. If you remember, we had a hubbub here four or five years ago about this and I believe things are pretty well under control. And I remember distinctly the debate on this as to whether to extend health insurance to temporary employees working for this. Apparently it's worked well. I think we have an obligation to do it and so, in contrast, I think I put the sunset on a few years ago, and I'll support taking the sunset off. Thank you, DiAnna Schimek.
