but they want to move it back now. And, finally, the Commission on Information Technology is eliminated. The commission was replaced by the Nebraska Information Technology Commission in 1998. With that, Mr. President, I would be happy to try to answer any questions.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. We are now discussing AM2159 to LB 654. Those wishing to talk, Senator Lynch, on the amendment.

SENATOR LYNCH: Could I ask Senator Schimek a...Mr. President, members, could I ask...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schimek, would you yield?

SENATOR LYNCH: ...Senator Schimek a question?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes.

SENATOR LYNCH: On the one, two, three, four bullets, the last two lines, it says this amendment also repeals the Employee Recognition Revolving Fund since it will be consolidated with the Personnel Division Revolving Fund. How much money is involved? There's, right now, as we look at the budget that's coming in from the administration, there's a lot of revolving funds, cash funds going to go from \$145 million; the reserve that we have, the savings account, is going to be taken down to \$80 million, so there's \$65 million. And I was curious, since this obviously involves some money and it's a revolving fund, how much is it, and how will the Personnel Division Revolving Fund be spent? Can you give us some idea?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, I will in a minute. If you would care to keep talking, I see that, once again, staff is coming back with the answers.

SENATOR LYNCH: Oh, okay. (Laugh) There's money being moved around like some of us have never seen before and this is another moving around type of issue, and I think we probably should have the right to understand how much and why.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, Senator, as I understand it, there are
