SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Schimek, will you...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...on this?

SENATOR CROSBY: ...will you respond to a quick question?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Certainly.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schimek, you are proposing an amendment yourself to what was before us last year?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The amendment that I have is proposed to what was there last year. So, if yours is accepted, then mine would have no application, because you will be changing that?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Exactly, and I think...I just quickly looked over your motion here, Senator. I think it gets to some of the same issues that my amendment does. And...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then what I'm...what I'm going to do is withdraw my amendment, see where we go in the discussion, and then I will know what it is I'm trying to amend, if I decide to do that. Thank you, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: So you are moving to withdraw your amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I'm withdrawing it.

SENATOR CROSBY: The motion is to withdraw the Chambers amendment. Any objections? Seeing none, the amendment is withdrawn.

CLERK: Madam President, the next amendment was one by Senator Kristensen. Senator Kristensen has indicated he would like that passed over at this time. The next amendment, Madam President, Senator Schimek, AM2005, Senator. (AM2005, Legislative Journal page 212.)
